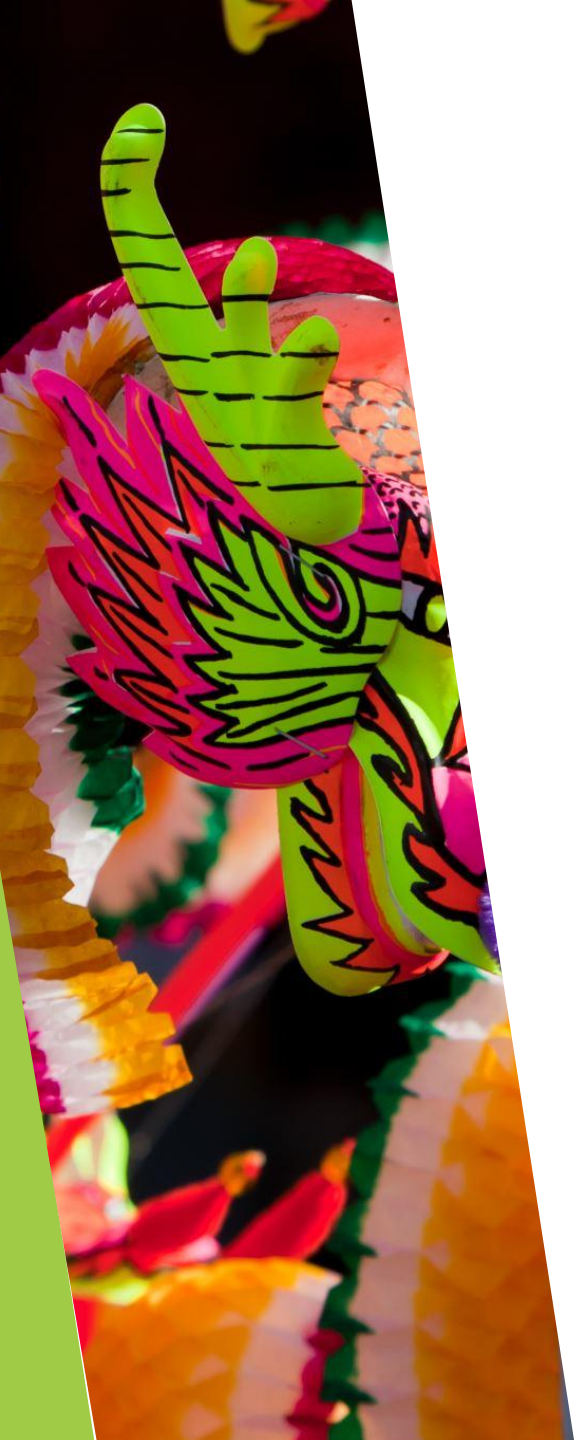

Reported Speech.

We use reported speech when we want to tell someone what someone said.

We usually use a reporting verb (e.g. say, tell, ask, etc.) and then change the tense of what was actually said in direct speech.

With reported speech we will use a past tense as we are reporting what had been said before.

If the original statement is in the past, then we will use the past perfect tense.

Example-

“I went to the Mardi Gras Festival.”

He told us he had gone to the Mardi Gras Festival.

You do not need to change the tense if the reporting verb is in the present, or if the original statement was about something that is still true.

Example-

“Jane works for a company that makes costumes for festivals.”

She said Jane works for a company that makes costumes for festivals.
